A Story of Impact

Much of the work that PFF does to make a difference for people with vulnerabilities is invisible to the community due to its confidential nature. Humbly and compassionately, PFF staff provide care, encouragement and support. The following story illustrates the power that support and community can make for someone. Truly, a night and day contrast.

When Claudia was first referred for services through PFF, she was living independently in poor housing conditions. At 65 years of age, Claudia had lived with her parents and her brother all of her life. After her family passed away, Claudia was on her own. While she owned her own home in a rural area, she had no heat, no electricity, and no indoor plumbing. Her inheritance was gone after she had fallen victim to a charismatic religious leader's plea for financial support. Claudia was left without financial resources, isolated and had virtually no social contact.

County social services intervened when a vulnerable adult report reached their desks, specifying that Claudia had sought treatment at a local emergency room for possible vermin bites. Through the courts, PFF was appointed to provide guardianship and conservatorship services to Claudia. Claudia moved into an assisted living facility where she received three meals each day. Claudia gained strength through proper nutrition. Additionally, her health improved when her medications were monitored with accurate timing and dosing.

Now, Claudia is thriving! She is in charge of the community garden at her assisted living facility. She attends group activities including cookouts, bingo, crafts and celebrations. With the support of PFF staff, Claudia's quality of life has increased dramatically.


